### Terms & Conditions of Entry

This exciting event offers New Zealand Māori, Pacific and Indigenous international students, currently enrolled in a PhD at a tertiary institution, the chance to present their research to a global audience and compete for some sponsored prizes. There are only 10 places available in the competition. Selection of the competitors will be at the discretion of the Organising Committee. Additionally:

- Doctoral candidates whose thesis is under examination are eligible to compete; however, students who have had their degree conferred do not qualify.
- Candidates accept that their participation in this competition may be photographed and filmed and these made available across the host's, Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga's website and social media sites.
- Candidates must be registered to attend the Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga's 2018 International Indigenous Research Conference to be eligible for selection.

### IIRC2018 3MT® Competition Rules

1. A single PowerPoint slide is permitted. No slide transitions, animations, or 'movement' of any description are allowed.
2. The slide is to be presented from the beginning of the oration.
3. No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are permitted.
4. No other props (e.g. musical instruments) are allowed.
5. Presentations are limited to 3 minutes maximum. Slides will be automatically set to a 3-minute timer. The timer will start as soon as the slide appears and end as soon as the slide disappears.
6. Presentations are to be spoken word (e.g. no poems, raps, songs, or other types of performances).
7. The presentation can be given in either English or te reo Māori.
8. The decision of the Judges Panel is final.

### What could I win?

A cash stipend of \$500 from Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga for the Best Presentation (one in English and one in te reo Māori) and some sponsored book prizes, including Audience Favourite, are up for grabs.

### Judging Criteria

- Communication style: was the thesis topic and its significance communicated in language appropriate to an intelligent but non-specialist audience?
- Comprehension: did the presentation help the audience understand the thesis topic?
- Engagement: did the presentation make the audience want to know more?
